On November 5, the community will decide on urgent facility needs for Randolph Public Schools with a school bond not to exceed \$9,750,000. The bond will enhance learning for all K-12 students. Here's how:

Improve **safety and security**

- Provide a secure vestibule at the Elementary School
- Add a new storm shelter
- Install fire sprinklers and modern fire alarms

Provide a modern **Career and Technical Education** building

- Replace the aging Ag building with a facility flexible enough for the career preparation classes of today and tomorrow

Preserve the **Elementary School** for years to come

- Update the electrical system
- Install energy efficient windows and lighting
- Replace original boiler with new HVAC
- Provide a Girls' restroom on the second floor
- Provide an additional Boys' restroom on the first floor
- Reduce lost classroom time and busing by adding a serving kitchen

Repair **structural and roofing issues** at Randolph High School and **add air conditioning** to the gym

Make Your Voice Heard!

Voters in Pierce County will be able to vote in person on November 5.

In Cedar and Wayne counties, this will be a mail-in election. Ballots will be mailed to registered voters on Oct. 14. Ballots must be returned before 5 pm on Nov. 5, 2024 within a sealed *Return Identification Envelope* to your county election office, by:

US Mail. Place the *Return Identification Envelope* and mail by **October 25**, or **hand deliver** the ballot to your county election office during business hours or put inside the **Election Drop Box**.

Financial Impact

The projected tax impact is 10.5 cents per \$100 of valuation, based on:

- 20-year bond
- Current bond interest rates of 4.30%
- The district's current valuation, using LB2 ag property values. LB2 converts ag land to 50% of assessed valuation for the purposes of a bond election per statute.

The chart to the right uses a weighted average of ag land valuations across the district's three counties.
